#### Dear Friends,

Are you thinking about New Year Resolutions? New Year's Day is coming and there is always the pressure to make resolutions that will help us be better in some way during 2020. And if we fail at them? Well, Lent is coming in about 8 weeks and we can try giving up our excuses for not following our resolutions and try again.

Resolutions show both our desire to improve in some way, and an effort to take some control of our lives. It's said that nobody knows the future, and we don't like that uncertainty. No one is thrilled about uncertainty. Over time, uncertainty about the future is a cause of great stress. We can see that stress act itself out in hopeful sounding resolutions and in world-weary sighs about things that don't change; in all sides of the discussion about what the year will bring; in efforts to make plans and efforts to deal with the unexpected.

One way to ease the stress is to remember that God is still at work in creation and in our lives. We aren't in this alone. Another way to deal with uncertainty is to not just make resolutions, but then try to make plans on how to carry out the resolutions. This is true for individuals and for churches. Last year, we all did some thinking about the future of the church and challenges facing it. Priority concerns are; 1. Work toward sustainable finance; 2. Outreach and membership growth; 3. Enrich the spiritual life and vitality; 4. Encourage openness to change. There will be continuing discussion and efforts of these among committees, at Session and among the congregation.

Another way to ease stress is to remember that we abide in Christ and are guided by his teachings. In worship times coming up, we will move from the visit of the wise men, then Jesus' baptism and public arrival, then witness the calling of the disciples and hear the first part of the Sermon on the Mount. We will remember that Christ calls us to be with him. Then Christ teaches us the values by which we are to live and on which we are to shape the future. In the face of uncertainty about the future of the nation, our communities, our church and our lives, let us remember and seek to live within the values Christ teaches.

### A Well-Deserved Congratulations to Al Fedak



The winner of the Vision 2020 #PCUSA2020 & Presbyterian Association of Musicians' Anthem Competition has been announced. "Blessed Are the Saints Who Trust in the Lord," composed by Al Fedak, won first prize. The anthem will be presented at the 224th General Assembly (2020) in Baltimore and the Presbyterian Association of Musicians' Worship & Music Conferences at Montreat in June-2020.

The contest called for an anthem that embodied the 2020 Vision Statement of the Presbyterian Church USA which was adopted in 2019. The statement calls for the church to be Prayerful, Courageous, United, Serving, Alive.

The anthem is one that Al had been commissioned to compose in honor of Leif Hartmark's brother, Kjell. He also submitted it to the competition. Our choir performed it here on November 10, without knowing it would be named the winning anthem.

### Anniversary Organ Recital

On Sunday, May 4, 1930, Westminster Church's organist, Mr. Stuart Swart, dedicated our church's landmark pipe organ by playing an afternoon organ recital.

To celebrate that instrument's 90th anniversary, Al Fedak will perform a concert on this same instrument on Sunday afternoon, February 2, at 3:00 pm. The program will include some rarely-heard but colorful selections composed by Walther, Richter, Zimmermann, Carré, Fedak, and others (including a work performed by Mr. Swart at his 1930 concert).

All are invited to attend this gala event in celebration of Westminster Church's E. M. Skinner pipe organ and its storied past. Admission is free, but donations are welcome—all proceeds will benefit the church's Music Performance Fund.

### January18 African Mission Day

African Mission
Day on January
18, 2020 will be
the 6th annual
event Westminster
has hosted to
help aid
children who lost
parents in the
devastating
Ebola epidemics
in Liberia and

Sierra Leone in 2014 and 2015. The Ebola epidemics were especially wretched for children. They were orphaned, left without extended family and were shunned and stigmatized by their own communities. Westminster responding quickly to the Ebola crisis in our partner countries. Since the epidemic started in 2014, the Church has supported Ebola orphans in Liberia and Sierra Leone.

Eleven Ebola orphans now live with Pastor and Mrs. Diggs at the Hope Mission School in Liberia and are fully supported by Westminster (including school fees). The 11 includes Baby Princess Freeman and two of her siblings.

Baby Princess has a typical story. When she was six months old, six of her relatives died from Ebola in a single week, including her mother and grandmother. Princess is now a thriving elementary school student and calls WPC member Felicia Kollie-Gambles "Mom" in their regular phone calls. Westminster also supports Ebola orphans at the M.O.M. orphanage in Freetown, Sierra Leone, who each receive a bag of food from Westminster four times a year.

The fundraising goal for African Mission Day is to sustain the Church's current annual support commitment of \$9,550 to Ebola orphans in Liberia and Sierra Leone. We have invited Mayor Collins to discuss his experiences as a refugee, as an immigrant to the USA, and as an elected official, as well as to share his aspirations for the future including for Liberia.

### Westminster Ghana Mission Trip 2020

In October 2020, a Westminster team will have a chance to visit our Mission partners in Tema, Ghana, and also attend the Ghana Mission Network meeting in Ghana. Mission trips like this help us put a face to our mission partners and appreciate the work, energy, and efforts they devote to our collaborative projects. Long-lasting cross-cultural relationships are developed. A Westminster team last visited Ghana in 2016, and our partners visited us in 2018.


The core trip dates for the 2020 trip will be approximately October 8 -18, with the addition of travel days and any independent travel that participants want to undertake. The visit would start in Tema, near Accra, Ghana's capital,

with visits to our partners and some of our collaborative projects. Our partners include Greenwich Meridian and Redemption Church, and the NGO affiliated with Redemption - the Home of Care and Protection (HOCAP). The team will then travel to the north of the country to the annual Ghana Mission Network meeting where teams from the USA and Ghana meet to reflect on how to develop their partnerships. Belinda Quaye and Gabriel Ofori-Okai of WPC are current members of the Ghana Mission Network Steering Committee. Please let Belinda

The trip will also be discussed during the January 5th African Mission second hour. A partial stipend and fundraising opportunities will be available to Westminster members.

# Westminster Sends \$10,000+ for African Projects "to Change the Lives of Children"

Thanks to a successful African Family Night fundraiser on November 9, Westminster is able to send end-of-year grants valued at more than \$10,000 to its five partners in West Africa, completing execution of the African Mission Budget announced in February 2019-

- -- \$5,000 in end of year grants is going to our three partners in Tema, Ghana to support projects for which they submitted detailed requests:
- Greenwich Meridian Church in Tema is refurbishing a room in an empty building of the school they operate. Their request said, "This library will benefit not only the school children but also the children in the Tema Community." Greenwich Meridian is also raising money for the Library.
- Tema's Redemption Church has a newly negotiated partnership agreement with a poorly funded public school located on land adjacent to Church property. Redemption asked for Westminster help to help construct a computer lab for the school, starting with computers sent by WPC earlier this year.
- HOCAP (Home of Care and Projection) has been raising money on Global Giving's website in the last three months for a well to irrigate the community garden started earlier this year in Nyitawuta (eastern Ghana). HOCAP asked for assistance to get them close to their \$10,000 goal by December 31. Once HOCAP has \$10,000 it will complete the specifics on constructing the well next year. The goal: enable farmers "to keep any growing crops irrigated throughout the season."
- -- \$5,500 is for Westminster partners in Liberia and Sierra Leone:
- For the Hope Mission School, the December monthly payment will include: \$1,750 for January scholarship funds for 41 students (needed in January; \$600 for the traditional end of year stipends for teachers and staff, and \$1,400 budgeted for bunk beds for Hope Mission Ebola orphans now sleeping on a dirt floor.
- For the M.O.M. orphanage in Freetown, supplies and donations will be sent this year to support a large M.O.M. Mission day in January. On Mission Day 17 computers and donated Bibles will be presented; both were requested during Fatmata Hilton's last visit. In addition, WPC's two representatives in Sierra Leone will give bags of food to every orphan and deliver 40 menstrual hygiene kits to be presented to girls who take a menstrual hygiene class.
