COME HOME: OUR ADVENT & CHRISTMAS FOCUS

Over the river and through the woods to Grandmother's house we go! Do you remember singing this bouncing little piece as a child? I sure do! It was my song.

And it didn't seem to matter that the trip was actually from our house to our aunt and uncle's house to which Grandma and Grandpa Case journeyed. There were river crossings and woods along the way. This song was mine!

The mere hint of the tune suggested everything that I loved about those Christmas dinners: the unalloyed affection in my life—Grandma—who lived by grace; the mysterious smell of Grandpa's pipe (long before anyone worried about second-hand smoke); the prospect of high adventures with cousins rarely seen; and, of course, the cornucopia of "goodies" that graced that table of love!

Over the river and through the woods to Grandmother's house we go! This was my song!

I am no longer a little boy. In time the song applied to trips to my parent's home with our children. Over time my heart has been tuned to sing other songs for Christmas. But the longing to return home—especially at Christmas— has never left me. As the Scriptures for this year's season of Advent and Christmas attest, this desire to come home is lodged deep in the human heart. We all long to go to our Father's house.

Listen to Zephaniah's call to come home:

"Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; Shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! At that time I will bring you home, at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes, says the LORD. (3:14,20)"

Centuries later, St. Augustine told the tale of everyone's heart:

"You arouse us to take joy in praising you, for you have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

As you plan for Christmas travels and celebrations and during this season of Advent and Christmas, also address the natural longing for the heart's true home. Our Advent themes will encourage you to come to aspects of the home we have in Christ: **Hope**, **Peace**, **Joy** and **Love**. Please come home to these. Think also of members who have been less visible and invite them to come home. Think of neighbors or family who could be blessed by the gospel's call to come home. Join our services and activities described elsewhere as a way come to the true heart of Christmas.

Grace and Peace to you!

On behalf of the FOCUS churches and organization, I want to wish you blessings of grace and peace as you read, celebrate, and witness in the waiting of Christ's coming in this Advent season.

Advent is a centuries old tradition that unites the church as we wait with expectation and hope for the birth of our Savior, Jesus. The word "Advent" in Latin literally means, "Coming." A word that implies something, or someone, notable is about to arrive. Maybe you're like me, and when you know a major event is coming up, or a particular guest will be arriving soon, you like to prepare for such noteworthy event. In a similar fashion, the four Sundays leading up to Christ's birth, the church prepares by meditating on hope, peace, joy, and love.

Advent 2018

One of the ways we are invited to participate in Advent is by reflecting on God's word in community. Which

brings us to this devotional. You'll find in this devotional twenty-four reflections on passages from all of Scripture, with voices from all of the FOCUS churches, FOCUS staff, as well as a reflection from one of the Breakfast Club guests. It is one of FOCUS' core beliefs that we worship and learn together, though we have differences, we come together in the name of Jesus as one united body of Christ. There may be some devotionals that confuse or surprise you, and that is okay. It's our hope that this will be an opportunity to lean in and learn from one another, rather than put up walls within denominations or people groups.

Each day, during Advent, you'll be asked to read the passage that is at the top of the page, followed with the devotional reflection on the Scripture, and then finishing with a prayer. You'll notice that each of the authors is named, along with their particular congregation or FOCUS affiliation if you'd like to follow up or even thank them for their writing.

Join with me as well as the whole of the FOCUS community as we turn towards Christ and hear the Scriptures afresh each day on our Advent journey.


May God embrace you, Christ enlighten you, and the Holy Spirit empower you in this season of waiting in expectation and hope for Christ's birth.

We Will No Longer be a Welcoming Church

For the sake of the church's future we need to quit being a welcoming church, and move to being an inviting church. It won't be easy, but let's commit to it. We'll do it in stages, easing our folks into it step by step. It will take total commitment in embracing a new focus.

Historically, churches have sunk an amazing amount of time and energy into becoming a welcoming church. We trained greeters and ushers, we wore name tags, we brewed coffee, we put our friendliest people in the most prominent places on Sunday mornings. It's now time to realize that simply continuing to do that will be misplacing our emphasis. These things will all continue but are seen as a means but not the end.


Instead, we will become an Inviting Church. That's different. You see, "welcoming" is passive. It denotes waiting for visitors and guests to drop by. When they do, we attempt treat them very well and do everything possible to make them comfortable. We'll do whatever it takes to have them come back the next Sunday. We'd love that. In effect, welcoming is actually about us, not about them.

"Inviting," however, is different. That means we leave the comfort of our congregational home-court advantage. The main activity doesn't happen in our worship space when people drop in, but in the neighborhood when we go out. It isn't so much welcoming them into our place, but going out into their place and meeting them there.

December, Month 1: We ask people to use the phrase "my church" in a conversation with one person each week. Really simple. "Just go two blocks past my church and you'll see the state capital." "No, I can't go away this Sunday; I've already made plans to be at my church." "Yes, my church is getting decorated for Christmas, too!" Just one person, one time each week during the month.


